Stephen began a career with the Bank of Canada in Saint John and Ottawa as an Auditor before shifting to a policing career. He graduated from the Atlantic Police Academy in 1978 and upon graduating, began working for the Rothesay Regional Police Force.

In 1985, he was certified as a Forensic Identification Officer and was promoted to the rank of Corporal in 1986. He was confirmed as Deputy Chief in April 1988, and was later appointed as Chief of Police in 1998, which was a position he held until retirement in November 2016.

During the course of his career, he belonged to several professional associations such as the New Brunswick Association of Chiefs of Police, and served as president of the association from 2010-2012 and was a New Brunswick Director with the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police for the same two year period. He served as a past member and President on the Board of Directors for Hestia House. He attended a Strategic Human Resource Management Certificate Program, with UNB and received the President's Award of Excellence in 2004. In 2012, he was inducted as a Member of the Order of Merit of the Police Forces and received his designation from the Governor General.
